AMHS is responding to a USDOT funding opportunity called SMART that is looking for innovative technology solutions to transportation challenges. They're building on recent interest in low-no emission ferries, with an initial consideration of routes includes Homer/Seldovia, Haines/Skagway, and Ketchikan/Saxman/Metlakatla (maybe a joint letter from Ketchikan/Saxman?).
