Manager's Update – April 20, 2023

Community Garden Action Plan: The Recreation Director and I met to discuss an action plan for the Community Garden at Seven Pastures. We hope to move forward in two phases.

In the short term, we would conduct a Phase I/II environmental assessment of the property and analysis of utility availability at the site. The existing gazebo will be used by the public and can be rented out for events, similar to the Dedman Stage and other municipal facilities. The existing community garden at the School would continue to be used during the transition time, and several volunteer days will be planned to encourage the community to engage with preparing and caring for the new Community Garden.

The longer-term phase of the action plan will delve into logistics related to parceling out space for and constructing individual garden beds, and improving the property to include retaining walls, a compost area, a tool shed, and more. We will likely request funds from the Assembly in the future in order to support the planned work.

Accessible Libraries Grant Award: Earlier this year, the Library Director applied for a "Libraries Transforming Communities (LTC): Accessible Small and Rural Communities Grant" with the hope of installing an automatic, accessible door for the front of the library. Assemblymember Deb Potter brought this to the attention of the Assembly, and Mayor Cremata wrote a letter of support for the application. The Library has been notified that they have been awarded a \$20,000 grant. I will be bringing forward information to the Assembly for its May 4 meeting so it can consider approval to accept the grant funds.

Facility use has been increasing weekly with the arrival of Skagway's seasonal workforce. Members have seen the staff very busy with changes to our office space and cardio floor. Our goal is to create more of an open feel in the facility and space out the equipment more evenly.

The Recreation Board met on Monday April 17th and they gave their support to begin the process of ending the sea kayak program at the Rec. There is correspondence to the assembly on the matter from the board and we believe if we can sell the kayaks & equipment the funds raised can be used to purchase new outdoor equipment for community use.

Some exciting upcoming events:

- The Community Rummage Sale is back! We are seeking volunteers to do intake and setup April 25-27th, help with the sale April 28th-30th, and clean-up efforts April 30th-May 1st. Sign-ups for volunteer shifts are on the front desk at the rec center. All proceeds go to recreation programming.
- The staff has been diligently working on planning the Summer Youth Program! Registration opens May 1st and cost is \$100/week. This camp is being offered for youth who will be entering 4th-6th grade in the fall of 2023. Camp dates are June 5th-8th, 12th-15th, 19th-22nd and July 10th-13th, 17th-20th, 24th-27th. Times are Noon-5:00pm daily, except on excursion days.
