Hi Emily,

Thanks so much! For sure – attached is the award letter for this grant, entitled "Libraries Transforming Communities: Accessible Small and Rural Communities." The grant (\$10,000 or \$20,000) is offered by the American Library Association (ALA) in partnership with the Association for Rural and Small Libraries (ARSL) in order to provide small and rural libraries with opportunities to increase the accessibility of facilities, services, and programs to better serve people with disabilities. I submitted an application for this grant in February 2023 with the hope that it might help to fund the installation of an automatic door at the front of the library. Currently, the heavy front door is difficult for visitors with physical disabilities, those who use mobility aids, caretakers with strollers, those with mobility challenges, and those entering with multiple small children. Today, April 19th, the ALA sent out the award notifications and informed the Skagway Public Library that our proposal was accepted and that we have been awarded a \$20,000 grant for this project!

Prior to the implementation of the project, grantees are required to first conduct community sessions where input can be gathered to ensure that the funded project aligns with local needs and to facilitate a community conversation about the improvement of the library's accessibility. I hope to conduct such a session at the end of summer/early fall. Grant winners are then expected to use the funds to improve their libraries based on the needs of the community before May 31st, 2024, so I hope to have work on the door begin through the winter of 2023/2024.

When I was writing the application for this grant, Tyson Ames estimated that the cost for the automatic door materials and shipping them to Skagway would come to around \$15,000. Labor costs for Public Works staff was estimated at \$6,500, so although approximately \$5,000 of this would be covered by the remainder of the grant, about \$1,500 would need to be covered by a different funding source, which I could potentially work into the FY24 library budget.

I think that's everything for now, but please let me know if you need anything else! I have lots of information from the application if you need any further details.
