## A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF SKAGWAY, ALASKA AMENDING SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL RATES.

WHEREAS, solid waste disposal rates must increase annually in order to adequately offset the cost of services; and

WHEREAS, despite these increases, the solid waste fund budget must be subsidized annually to meet the cost of services;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Assembly of the Municipality of Skagway that the Solid Waste Rates are amended as follows:
