When the mighty spruce trees in Bud Matthew's yard were cut down after his passing and under new ownership several nests of Merlins were destroyed. I observe the merlins now hanging out in the spruce at this location and believe they too deserve to remain. There is also a sweet spot of 4 leaf clovers in this location.

In addition, making changes to encroach and develop/reroute Pullen creek would significantly increase the price tag on whatever project is chosen to be built.
