

On the following LARGE (!)Table are the results of Objectives & Actions Public Votes, Planning &Zoning Commissioner ranking, and comments.

Rows shaded light yellow are the public’s 17 top ranked objectives or actions.

There are 3-4 objectives or actions that all deal with water and sewer extension, they each have red font so you can see the overlap (interesting they all got top votes in their topics).

When ranking, each planning commissioners did something a little different, all assigned at last 1-4 (for top 4 priorities), some assigned 1-10 or more. Some ranked only actions, others ranked objectives or actions.

If this were a quantitative exercise, I’d be freaking out because the direction was obviously unclear.

However, I’m not worried because the main purposes were to get a sense of any areas where the commission is far apart with each other, or with the public. In addition, it does this. Also, it ‘forced’ you to read all the objectives and actions ☺
